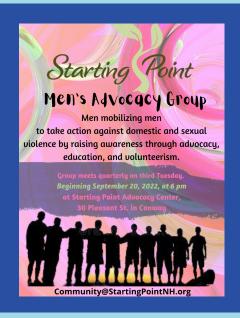

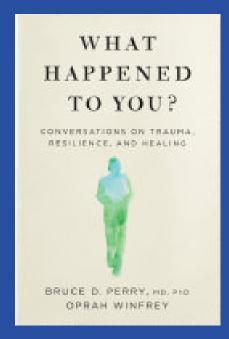

Conversations on Trauma, Resilience, and Healing by Dr. Bruce Perry and Oprah Winfrey

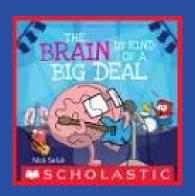
